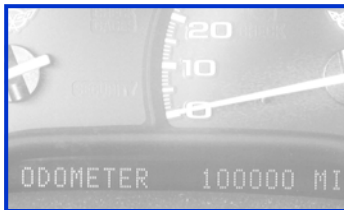
Breaking News
